Bryan Akipa is a member of the Sisseton-Wahpeton tribe who is committed to teaching all people the values in traditional Sioux arts and culture. Trained in elementary education, Mr. Akipa has been active in teaching art and culture since 1980. He has created a program designed to educate children and adults about the values of Sioux culture, including team work, perseverance and respect for elders.

His hope is to increase people's knowledge, respect and awareness of themselves and others by providing children and youth with experience in traditional Dakota developmental games, roles and songs.

Mr. Akipa teaches, demonstrates performs and lectures widely on flute carving and playing, traditional dance and traditional games. He is a Northern Plains Tribal Arts traditional carving award winner.

All presentations begin at 7:00 p.m. and are followed by discussion. There is no charge for admission.
